Legislative News.... Tom Moscovic More Good - More Bad - More Ugly 2023 - A Year Voices Were Heard and Pushed Representative Democracy Forward

In 2023, here in Ohio we made our voices heard loud and clear in August and November elections. Democracy prevailed and we the people kept our rights. The Ohio AFL-CIO local foundations saw 163 of the 206 endorsed local candidates win placing 27 of the 43 union members in local office, board and council positions. That is Union Strong in action. We made progress in state funding of education highlighting the need for less reliance on property taxes. For retirees more pensions got PBG support from the American Rescue Plan Butch Lewis Act. The public pension systems years of political pressure and big Wall street deals are now under scrutiny. We made progress in funding home and community based long term care in the state budget. The worker elected and work friendly Biden administration is forcing Big Pharma to show up and bargain Medicare Rx Drug prices because we demand it. Not a bad year for the chaos in Congress and the Ohio General Assembly.

Senate Bill 83 is SB 5 redo to Take Apart Collective Bargaining a Piece at a Time

SB83 in an attack on the substance of collective bargaining and the freedom of speech in the workplace. This is how little fieldoms are born and grow into intimidation and dictatorial bosses refusing to hear workers voices.

SB83 is BAD for Students. BAD for Higher Education. BAD for Ohio. Attacks academic freedom, tenure, and students' freedom to learn. Weaponizes "intellectual diversity" to censor honest inclusive education and critical thinking. Dismisses race, culture identity, lived experience as "controversial beliefs and policies", attacks workers' rights creating unfit working conditions and unsafe learning environments. Legislative continued... OK to think.

Matt Smith, Ohio AFL-CIO Legislative Director provides the following update as part of their Union Strong solidarity against Senate Bill 83-the Higher Education destruction act. "I am writing with the unfortunate news that SB83 passed out of the House Higher Education committee after an 8-7 vote. Chairman Young did not allow any verbal testimony after adding the bill to the committee agenda less than 24 hours in advance of the hearing. Vice-chair Manning actually called for a vote over objections of Democrats. It is widely known that she had been a NO vote on the bill until very recently. For Representative Manning to flip without a clear reason, is very frustrating. Some legislators think that because the anti-strike language was removed, that our concerns have been addressed. That is simply not true. SB83 still includes anti-collective bargaining language that some would argue, is even worse than the original anti-strike language. Any attack on collective bargaining is an attack on labor. This is a bad bill for workers, a bad bill for students, and could really put our institutes of higher learning at a competitive disadvantage moving forward.

While an irritating turn of events, we must continue to fight and turn up the pressure. We must do all we can to keep SB83 off the House floor.....Now would be a good time to reach out to them and ask for a NO on SB83 should it come up for a floor vote. I should also mention that two Republican Reps. voted no with all of the Democratic committee members-Reps. Gail Pavliga and Justin Pizzulli. Have you every received a notice on line from your bank stating that there was "a problem with your account or that your account was overdrawn?" Don't start typing in all of your information that is requested on the notice. Don't start clicking or start writing in all of the what might be requested on the email. Don't write in your account number or your password. The notice that you received is possibly a scam, and there are many scammers today who will try anything to get a "free buck!"

According to The Federal Trade Commission, adults between 60 and 70 report they have been defrauded with median losses of \$666 and \$1,000, those in the 50's have median losses of \$552, \$600 for those in their 40's

Scams can happen in many different ways. On a personal note, I was scammed a few years ago by clicking on a link that was a tech support scam. It was about maintenance on my computer and <u>appeared</u> to be sent from Microsoft. Believe me, it was not. Before I knew it, money was taken from my bank account and I was asked to purchase gift cards and send them to the address provided on the email. In a panic, I phoned my son who lives nearby and was at the time working for Visa. He straightened everything out including me. However, my computer had to be scrubbed, my bank account closed and I had to inform the Federal Trade Commission that the whole incident had happened.

Now when I get an email and do not recognize the address it came from I delete it immediately. If it is not a business I deal with it is deleted. If it is a business I deal with I call them to check if they really sent that particular email. I definitely learned a lesson the hard way.

The News-Herald, January 2, 2024, printed an article "Better Business Bureau releases Top 10 scams of past year". It was from the Better Business Bureau of Greater Cleveland with reports from Cuyahoga, Lake Lorain, Geauga and Ashtabula counties. The article stated that

"The continued influence of steady inflation and the changing dynamics of the job market have played a large part in how scammers chose to target their victims in 2023."


