Alerts from the Lake County Sheriff's Office <u>Wireless Emergency Notification Systems</u> (WENS)

In January 2021, the Lake County Emergency Management System (WENS) upgraded our VESTA Alert system to the Wireless Emergency Notification System to help notify our citizens during our times of emergency. The new system adds to the capability of reaching Lake County citizens with important emergency information through automated voice calls, text messages, and emails. Residents may also opt to receive NOAA Weather Warnings (i.e. Severe Thunderstorm Warnings, Lake Effect Snow Warnings, etc.)

All messages originating from Lake County will include important information, along with instructions on what to do during the emergency, Specific criteria has been designated for the use of WENS. The criteria could be any one more of the following:

- Conditions exist where affected resident could be, or have the potential to be in immediate danger
- There is a potential for serious risk to life and property
- Notification could aid in the apprehension of a criminal suspect
- Notification could aid in the safe return of a lost child
- Notification could aid in the safe return of a mentally, physically or emotionally challenged individual or an elderly patient (walk away from a nursing facility)

In order to receive this important information, all you have to do is make sure you're registered in our database. All residents of Lake County with a published landline telephone number, and up via the old VESTA selfregistration portal, were imported into the new WENS system. Anyone that wishes to add, or update, their cell phone to receive emergency notification calls, text messages, emails or the optional weather alerts needs to provide their information on the form available at https://entry.inspironlogistics.com/lake oh/wens.cfm

All information provided to the Lake County EMA via the self-registration portal will not be shared with anyone for any reason. It is important that this information is shared with us, so that we may keep you safe in times of emergency,

LEGISLATIVE REPORT....

By Tom Moscovic GOP Sets Sights on Public Education.....Current Legislation Pending

Universal vouchers (House Bill 290)

The biggest potential change lurking in the legislature is the "backpack bill." If passed, every school –aged child would be eligible for either a \$5,500(K-8 grade) or \$7,500 (9-12 grade) voucher. Parents could spend these dollars on private school tuition, home school supplies, advanced placement testing or education therapies.

"HB290 would create a true money follows the child approach to education funding," bill sponsor Rep. Riordan, McClain, R– Upper Sandusky, said when he introduced the idea in October. The bill had its first hearing in February and one of the biggest outstanding questions was how much could this cost Ohio.

"I can't imagine a fiscal note of less than \$1billion if you are going to give all current, private and home school students a voucher," Aldis said. And that is what worries many Democrats and public school advocates.

Ohio doesn't have \$1 billion to spare in the budget in its budget. Nor can the state shave that the money from its education funds without making serious cuts.

It's about providing tuition subsidies to the people who have already chosen not to go to public school," said Steve Dyer, the director of government relations for the Ohio Education Association.

Teaching "divisive concepts" (Bills 322 and 327)

One of the biggest issues in education over the last year Has been the debate over how schools teach about racism, slavery and other "divisive concepts." Supporters believe a set of rules outlining the parameters of these discussions will protect the "accurate" teaching of American history and keep teachers from pushing, "dangerous" and "divisive" ideologies in students. Opponents say the laws are designed to "whitewash" history and intimidate teachers and keep kids from participating in the political process. Lawmakers haven't voted on either, but House Bill 327 has had five committee hearings and multiple amendments. The sponsors say they are working to find consensus around language that can pass.

Posting curriculums online (House Bill 529)

Republican Rep. Brett Hillyer proposed a way to "tone down" the heated rhetoric around "divisive concepts" by mandating teachers post their curriculum online. "I don't have to get into the minutia of what is being taught," Hillyer said when introducing the idea in January. I can just say `Hey, let's make it available to parents," The Tuscarawas County Republican didn't think his plan would create extra work for educators either. Ohio law already requires schools to provide course material upon request.

But Heather Stambaugh, a history teacher from Greenon Local School District, said it is not about the work so much as the message. "It's the implication of `Look, they are hiding something,' she said.

Now the Good News -STRS

At the February meeting of the State Teachers Retirement Board, actuarial consultant Cheiron provided further analysis of potential benefit improvements designed to benefit both active and retired members of the system. The board expressed interest in various options that included a one-time cost of living adjustment (COLA) for eligible benefit recipients and a change to the current age and service eligibility for active members, which would allow teachers of any age and service eligibility of to retire at any age (eliminating the age 60 requirement set to be put in place in 2026). The board is also considering a reduction in the member contribution rate to 13% from 14%. Cheiron will complete its analysis of the financial impact of the proposed changes at the March Board Meeting.

Programs for LCRTA 2022: the following are programs scheduled for Luncheon and Business Programs for the Lake County Retired Teachers Association for the remainder of 2022;


