LEGISLATIVE: Tom Moscovic reported.

This week DeWine signed House Bill 99 into law, which allows an adult to carry a gun on school property with only 20 hours of training and only two hours of hands-on training with a gun. Opponents to the bill included the OEA and the Fraternal Order of Police of Ohio. In March, DeWine signed a new law that allows people 21 or older, who are legally allowed to own a gun, permission to conceal that weapon without training or a permit. It eliminates the requirement that those carrying guns "promptly" inform law enforcement when stopped. The gun owner will have to inform only when an officer asks if a weapon is being carried.

The results of the State Teachers Retirement Board Election showed that Jeffrey Rhodes, Rob McFee and Rita Walters lost their seats. Steve Foreman, Elizabeth Jones and Julie Sellers will begin their term in September 2022.

SCHOLARSHIP: Tim Niederkorn reported.

In fall 2022, the Scholarship Committee will begin work on the 2022 - 2023 scholarship process. The five 2021 - 2022 "Dine to Donate" events sponsored by the committee raised \$824.11.
